



Pockets and Flaps Interactive Waterfall or Flip Card Memory Page

The waterfall mechanism is a cool interactive addition that can be used just as a card, attached to a card, or on any size scrapbook page. Try making one that is horizontal instead of vertical. You will be sure to get plenty of oohh's and ahhh's from folks who receive these cool little objects!

Supplies:

Dog Stamp (100 Proof Press)
 Sentiment Stamp (100 Proof Press)
 Paw Print Stamp (The Angel Company™) (retired)
 Abundance Is Stamp Set (The Angel Company™)
 Palette Black Noir Ink Pad (Stewart Superior)
 Brilliance Rocket Red Ink Pad (Tsukineko)
 Pets 12x12 Dog Words Paper (Making Memories)
 Pets 12x12 Dog Bones Paper (Making Memories)
 8½ x 11" Red Cardstock (unknown)
 Digital Photos
 Clear Micro Beads (Pennywise Arts)
 O'So Sticky Redliner ¼" Tape (Pennywise Arts)
 2 Red Eyelets (Making Memories)
 Clear Microbeads (Pennywise Arts)
 Paw Print Punch (EK Success)
 Ribbon – approximately 8" length
 Corner Rounder Punch (Carl Mfg. Co.)
 Fine Point Sharpie Pen (Sanford)
 Crop-a-Dile (We R Memory Keepers)

Paper Cuts:

Page – 6" x 6" Dog Words Paper
 Waterfall Mechanism - 9" x 3¼"
 Anchor Piece – 1⅛" x 4¾"
 Squares – 3" x 3" Dog Bones Patterned Paper, cut 4
 2¾" x 2¾" Red Cardstock, cut 4
 1 ¼" x 1 ¼" Red Cardstock, cut 1
 Digital Pictures - 2½" x 2½" (be sure to center photo), 4 photos

To make Waterfall Mechanism:

1. Take the 9" x 3¼" piece of cardstock and score at: 1 ½", 2 ¼", 3", and 3¾". Fold scores to create mountain folds (^).
2. Layer 3 Dog Bones paper squares with 3 red cardstock squares using your favorite adhesive.
3. Punch photos in the lower right-hand corner with Paw Print punch, if desired, and write your pets' names on each picture. Layer these on top of the previously layered squares, using your favorite adhesive.
4. Stamp the remaining Dog Bones paper square with the dog stamp. Using a scrap piece of red cardstock, tear an edge, cut to 3" long and attach to the top of the square. Stamp the 'It's a dog's Life' sentiment on a piece of 1¼" square red cardstock with the black ink. Cut a 1 ¼" x 1 ¼" square piece of the O'So Sticky Redliner Tape. Remove backing and adhere to the piece just stamped. Remove the redliner from the tape on the square and adhere the beads to the tape. I put the beads



into a dish and press the tape into the beads, then using my fingers, press the beads into the tape. This tape is very, very sticky and the beads will remain stuck to the tape. If there are holes between beads, press the piece into the beads in the dish again and press down with fingers until the square is completely filled with microbeads.

5. Take the O'So Sticky Redliner Tape, cut 4 pieces measuring 3" long and adhere to the back of each square. (Do not remove the red liner yet!)
6. Starting at the 1 1/2" fold, remove the redliner from the tape on the back of the square you want at the bottom of the waterfall. Center square at the bottom edge of the fold and adhere. (Be sure you have it aligned correctly. Once the piece is adhered you will not be able to remove it!)
7. Take the next square and repeat step 6 at the 2 1/4" fold.
8. Repeat for the next 2 squares having the stamped/embellished square on the top.
9. Set aside the waterfall mechanism for now.

To complete the page:

1. Take the anchor piece and distress the edges with the red ink pad using a direct to paper method. To do this, rub the edges of the paper along the surface of the ink pad.
2. Center this piece to the 6" x 6" piece of Dog Words paper. Placing the bottom edge approximately 2" from the bottom and about 5/8" in from the side edges. Using the Crop-a-Dile, punch holes using the 1/8" setting. Try to center the holes on each side about 1/4" to 1/2" from each side. Make sure that you don't go too far in or the waterfall mechanism will not fit! Use the Crop-a-Dile to fasten each eyelet in the holes just punched.
3. Place the long end of the waterfall piece under the anchor piece. Keep the folded upper portion with the photo



squares (folds mountain side up (^) and over the top of the anchor piece. Cut 2 pieces of 1/4" O'So Sticky Redliner Tape 3 1/4" long. Center each piece to the top and bottom edges of the anchor piece between the eyelets. Making sure you keep the folded portion out of the way, remove the redliner on the tape, line up the bottom of the folded portion, and stick to the anchor piece lining up the edges with the tape.

4. Punch a hole at the bottom of the piece under the anchor and insert ribbon. This is the pull tab to make the waterfall mechanism work.
5. Stamp sentiments just above the pull ribbon tab.
